**EDMONTON, AB** – The **Art Gallery of Alberta** (AGA) will shake things up for Mother's Day with a ***Make Some Noise!*** themed *All Day Sunday* on May 9 from 10 am to 5 pm. Taking inspiration from Janet Cardiff and George Bures Miller's audio installations, ***The Murder of Crows*** and ***Storm Room***, the *All Day Sunday* event will include art-inspired activities designed for Gallery patrons of all ages. Visitors will be able to create musical instruments, listen to a storyteller from T.A.L.E.S., participate in a dance-off and join in the production of an AGA music video. Working with equipment supplied by *Film and Video Arts Society of Alberta* (FAVA) and led by local filmmaker Katrina Beatty of *Loud Whisper Productions*, kids and adults alike will get to participate in the filming of a music video with music supplied by local musician Rob Batke from Edmonton-based band *The Faunts*.

### **ABOUT THE ART GALLERY OF ALBERTA**

The Art Gallery of Alberta is a centre of excellence for the visual arts in Western Canada, connecting people, art and ideas. The AGA is focused on the development and presentation of original exhibitions of contemporary and historical art from Alberta, Canada and around the world. The AGA also offers a full-range of art education and public programs. Founded in 1924, the Art Gallery of Alberta maintains a collection of more than 6,000 objects and is the oldest cultural

institution in Alberta and the only museum in the province solely dedicated to the exhibition and preservation of art and visual culture. The AGA recently underwent a major re-building project. Designed by Los Angeles architect Randall Stout, the 85,000 sq foot (7,900 sq metres) new AGA opened to the public on January 31, 2010. The new Gallery features three floors of premiere exhibition space; the City of Edmonton Terrace; the Singhmar Centre for Art Education; Zinc resto lounge; Shop AGA; Ledcor Theatre and an Art Rental and Sales Gallery.
